

Awards

Stuart A. Bremer Travel Award For the Best Graduate Student Paper

Co-authored papers may be considered for the award if all of the authors are graduate students at the time of the meeting.

The author(s) of the winning paper receives travel support of \$2000 to present the paper at the 2025 meeting of the Network of European Peace Scientists in Barcelona, Spain. The winner will be selected on the basis of the paper's potential scientific significance and its contribution to the study of peace science. Nomination must be made by one of the authors of the paper.




